

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE CHIEF CONSTABLE OF SUSSEX

Issue of audit opinion on the financial statements

In our audit report for the year ended 31 March 2022 issued on 30 November 2022 we reported that, in our opinion, the financial statements:

- gave a true and fair view of the financial position of the Chief Constable of Sussex as at 31 March 2022 and of its expenditure and income for the year then ended; and
- had been prepared properly in accordance with the CIPFA/LASAAC Code of Practice on Local Authority Accounting in the United Kingdom 2021/22.

Delay in certification of completion of the audit

In our report dated 30 November 2022, we explained that we could not formally conclude the audit and issue an audit certificate until we had completed the work necessary to issue our assurance certificate in respect of the Authority's Whole of Government Accounts consolidation pack. This assurance statement has now been issued and the NAO as group auditor has confirmed that no further assurances will be required from us as component auditors of the Chief Constable of Sussex.

No matters have come to our attention since that date that would have a material impact on the financial statements on which we gave an unqualified opinion and no matters have come to our attention that would have resulted in a different opinion on the financial statements or additional exception reporting on significant weaknesses in the Chief Constable's value for money arrangements.

We certify that we have completed the audit of the accounts of the Chief Constable of Sussex in accordance with the requirements of the Local Audit and Accountability Act 2014 and the Code of Audit Practice issued by the National Audit Office.
