



Attaining Level 2 English and Maths or equivalent

Why do I need English and Maths at Level 2?

All apprentices working at higher level or degree level will require a Level 2 Maths and English qualification in order to progress through and ultimately achieve their apprenticeship.

Also, other roles within Surrey Police and Sussex Police will require these qualifications due to the high level of training carried out prior to starting the role.

I am not able to evidence my qualification, what should I do?

If you are unable to evidence your qualifications, you should first speak to your school or examination board about obtaining new certificates as proof of attainment.

If your examining board no longer exists you can [visit gov.uk](https://www.gov.uk) to find details on how to obtain a replacement certificate.

I do not have Level 2 in either English or Maths, what should I do?

If you do not have level 2 functional skills or GCSE Maths and/or English, you can obtain these by approaching a functional skills training provider to find out what courses they are running which will allow you to attend training sessions (face to face or online), take the exam and then be in a position to apply.

I am taking an online course, should I be doing the exam face to face?

Yes, you are able to take the course online, but the exam must be taken face to face. Please make sure the provider you select offers this option when it comes to your exam as it will need to be invigilated at a training centre.

How much will it cost?

If you do not have a Level 2 or above in English and/or Maths, then you should be able to study the qualifications for free. Please ensure that you check the terms and conditions of the provider you are looking to use.

What are the qualification options?

There are two options to gain a Level 2 in either English and/or Maths:

- GCSE in English and/or Maths

GCSEs are widely recognised as being qualifications which are studied during secondary school, however they are also available for adult learners.

An educational institution will normally offer adult learners the opportunity to attend day or evening classes, over a period of approximately 9 months, to attain the knowledge. The GCSE examination(s) will be sat at the end.

- [Functional Skills level 2 in English and/or Maths](#)

Functional Skills are an alternative qualification to GCSEs in English and Maths. They are available for adult learners.

The curriculum for Functional Skills focuses on the “functional” aspect of Maths and English. It provides realistic contexts for the application of knowledge, skills and understanding.

An educational institution may offer flexibility in the way in which they deliver Functional Skills. For example, they may deliver the learning in a shorter timescale. Functional Skills examinations will be sat when the learner is ready.

How can I access the learning?

What if I am ready to sit a GCSE or Functional Skills examination without needing to undertake learning?

Some educational institutions will offer you the opportunity to sit an examination without having delivered a full curriculum of learning. *Please note that there would be a cost to this.* The best way to identify these institutions is through conducting an internet search.

I have qualifications from outside the UK, how do I know if they are equivalent to a Level 2?

If you have a qualification that is not from the UK then you will require a [NARIC statement of comparability](#) if you wish to use to use these qualifications. There is a cost to this, however it is an Educational Skills and Funding Agency (ESFA) requirement that a learner holds one of these in those circumstances.
